Pickens Explains His Support for Totalitarian Cap-and-Trade Bill

Billionaire T. Boone Pickens, who has supported many worthy free-market causes in his life, explained on the "Glenn Beck Program" Tuesday his curious support for the Democrats' totalitarian <u>cap-and-trade</u> legislation.
