



Trump bashes US-Saudi Arabia relations, slams NATO allies

Although his campaign has seemed bulletproof up until now, his latest controversies - including abortion, opponent Ted Cruz's wife and a journalist who said she was roughed up by Trump's campaign manager - have alienated women voters further, polls indicate.

Trump has frequently criticised North Atlantic Treaty Organisation in recent weeks as the race for the Republican nomination for the Nov 8 election has heated up.

Clinton said: "They don't understand that I've got a plan to defeat ISIS and it requires actually working with other nations, including Muslim nations that have to be part of our coalition".

However, Trump's campaign was also predicting success, saying they would be "popping champagne" if the state party's initial list were elected, with 18 of the final 25 having appeared on that initial list.

Cruz used the event to make his first appearance with Wisconsin Gov. Scott Walker, whose endorsement he earned earlier this week.

"John Kasich has the worst spending policy of any governor", reads one Wisconsin mailer, citing figures from the Cato Institute. There's speculation the party could turn at the nominating convention to a "white knight" such as House Speaker Paul Ryan.

Cruz, Trump's closest challenger, has only a small chance to overtake him in the delegate hunt before the convention.

Because the delegates will be unbound, they are not formally committed to any campaign.

Trump also defended his recent criticism of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization, or NATO. Both hope to deny Mr Trump a delegate majority in what is left of the primary season, forcing the nomination to be settled at a contested convention at which one of them might emerge as the nominee.

And what if he falls short? She said Trump was "pro-life with exceptions" and said his statements after the comments in an MSNBC interview were an accurate depiction of his views.

He urged supporters to come out in droves on Tuesday.

"Ted Cruz was my roommate".

At a campaign stop in Wausau, Wisconsin yesterday, Trump expressed concerns over the United States' relationship with oil-rich Saudi Arabia, which Trump accused of not pitching in fair pay for U.S. defence.

Several times, Trump emphasized that his comments Wednesday were in response to a hypothetical situation.

Dozens of outraged Donald Trump supporters are protesting the state's Republican Party Saturday, accusing party leaders of attempting to tamp down on support for the GOP presidential front-runner as they move to finalize Tennessee's delegation to the national convention.

"Caucuses are the wild, wild west", said strategist Rob Gray, who worked on Jeb Bush's since-suspended campaign.

That won't happen in California, where voters registered with no party preference have always been welcomed in Democratic presidential primaries, but not by the Republicans. His solution: "Set up a tent city".

Kasich proposed a novel approach to strengthening Social Security at a town-hall gathering with a few hundred people in Burlington, Wisconsin, on Saturday morning. "Because you can say things one way and the press will criticize you horribly".

With polls for the Wisconsin Republican primary showing the ultraconservative Cruz holding a 10-point lead, Trump has launched a series of events in the heartland state to rally support.

Mrs Clinton said she was confident the two campaigns could settle on a debate date before the NY primary.

"Yeah, it was a mistake", he told columnist Maureen Dowd.
