

? CORNYN TO INTRODUCE LIBYA RESOLUTION. Sen. John Cornyn plans to introduce the first non-binding resolution in the Senate which calls for a regime change in Libya. An excerpt from the resolution:

"Expressing the sense of the Senate that United States policy should be to remove Muammar Qaddafi from power in Libya, and calling on the President to submit a plan to achieve that goal and to seek congressional authorization for the use of military force against Libya."

Cornyn's resolution calls for President Barack Obama to submit to Congress a description of U.S. policy objectives during and after Gadhafi's rule. The resolution also states that the president should seek authorization from Congress for military actions in Libya.

Although Cornyn's resolution is likely to be the first in the Senate regarding Libya, it certainly isn't the last. According to Foreign Policy superstar Josh Rogin, Sens. John Kerry, D-Mass., John McCain, R-Ariz., and Joe Lieberman, I-Conn., are working on a resolution they hope will garner support from both sides of the aisle. Read more from Foreign Policy>>>

? TOM LEPPERT HAS 'POSITIVE CONVERSATIONS' WITH CORNYN. But he didn't receive an endorsement. Didn't even ask for it. The former Dallas mayor says he had "positive conversations" about his Senate bid with National Republican Senatorial Committee Chairman Cornyn, R-San Antonio, but did not seek his endorsement. The race for Sen. Kay Bailey Hutchison's seat in 2012 is already crowded, with Leppert competing against former Railroad Commissioner Michael Williams and former Secretary of State Roger Williams, among others. Lt. Gov. David Dewhurst is also a strong contender, should he make a bid. More from The Hill>>>

The administration maintains that the two trade agreements aren't ready, "prompting Republicans to declare that they won't act on any trade matters, not a pending trade accord with South Korea and certainly not with Russia, until the Colombia and Panama accords are submitted" writes Bloomberg's Jim Abrams. ### On Deck: Today


- ? The House Energy and Commerce Committee Oversight and Investigations Subcommittee holds a hearing on "The U.S. Government Response to the Nuclear Power Plant Incident in Japan" at 9 a.m. EDT.
- ? The Federation for American Immigration Reform holds its "Hold Their Feet to the Fire" radio talk show town hall meeting today and tomorrow. Talk radio hosts from all across the country will spend two days interviewing members of Congress, immigration reform experts and law enforcement personnel.
- ? The House Natural Resources Committee considers three offshore drilling bills offered by Chairman Doc Hastings, R-Wash at 10 a.m. EDT.

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#### On Deck: Later this week

- ? Thursday. The House Energy and Commerce Committee holds a hearing on proposals, possibly including one by Rep. Pete Olson, R-Sugar Land, that would force more disclosure of the impacts of energy and environment related regulations.
