

Rouhani is akin to a wolf in sheep's clothing

Over nearly a year has passed since Hassan Rouhani put in charge on 3 August 2013 until today, despite the demagogic and deception promises, he has not been successful to fulfill any of his campaign promises.

Rouhani's Background

Hassan Rouhani is a representative for the ruling class, not a representative of the people!

He was secretary of the Supreme National Security Council as the representative of the Supreme Leader from 1989 to 2013. During these years he was the chief of nuclear negotiation team of Iran's nuclear program, involving with three countries, France, Great Britain and Germany. Since 1992 to 2013 he was president of the Strategic Research Center of Expediency Council. In 1999 he was Tehran representative in the Assembly of Experts and has been a member of Expediency Council since 1991. Hassan Rouhani has played a significant role in the repression of the student movement in 1999. Not only he is not people's representative but he is an undisputed compliant and representative of the supreme leader of Iran.

Hassan Rouhani, is one of the founders of "women Hijab" in the beginning of the rise of the Islamic Republic in 1979.

Execution

In recent months of Hassan Rouhani Presidency, despite of his human rights promises, we have been witnessed more than 600 executions. And hundreds of prisoners under sentence of death, are passing their last moments of their life.

Arrest and imprisonment

Wave of arrests not only did not decrease, but also has increased. Only a few numbers of well-known political and civil prisoners were free in order to deceive human rights organizations and the international community. But still thousands of political and conscience prisoners remain in detention by regime.

In this regard, I'd like to attract your attention to the brutal and unjustified attacks of security forces and plainclothes to section 350 of Evin. In this attack, a large number of political prisoners were seriously injured and dozens of them were sent to solitary confinement.

Prisoners suffer from lack of medicine and medical facilities, which is a hidden and silent execution.

Meanwhile, the uncertainty and undecided cases of prisoners cannot be ignored.

And despite promises they do not allow any international organizations and authorities to visit prisons.

Despite Rouhani's promise and invitation of all Iranians to return to Iran, dozens of political and civil activists have been detained after returning to Iran.

The pressures, arrests and persecution of labor activists should not be ignored. Dozens of labor activists are in prisons with heavy sentences because of expressing their demands related to workers syndicate and union.

Ethnic and religious minorities

The past year can be named as year of oppressing ethnic and religious minorities in Iran. Wave of Arrests of Baha'is, Christians, Sunnis, Sufis, Baluochs, Kurds, Arabs, has significantly increased.

Violation of LGBT rights is the biggest challenges in Iran. Iran denies the existence of homosexuals. It can be said that homosexuals are among the most disadvantaged members of society because the conservative and religious segments of society doesn't welcome them. In this context, we can mention suspicious killings of homosexuals in various parts of Iran in recent months.

Preventing ethnic and religious groups and political-civil activists from education and employment is another problem that hasn't changed in the Rouhani's presidency.

Freedom of Expression and the Internet

Freedom of speech and free Internet not only has been unchanged compared to previous years, but also with successive filtering of sites and social networks freedom of speech has been violated more than before.

Another issue is closure of newspapers and magazines, even newspapers that had little criticism.

Due to the high priority of issues regarding political and conscience prisoners, human rights activist has ignored or forgot other human rights violations.

After Rouhani's presidency, Guidance or moral police has continued his work and had a strict behavior in facing women and youths in the streets regarding their dresses. The relative of the Islamists and the regime revealed their protest against improper "Hijab" in a march planned by the government.

This is the old trick of the regime that always begins with a series of such presentations to prepare the mind of the society for more suppression and attack.

According to a recent report by the Cato Institute in America, among 90 countries, Iran the misery index has the second place after Venezuela. Misery index reached 61.6 percent which confirms the words of the Minister of Economy of Hassan Rouhani. Iran's inflation rate exceeds 40 percent while the real figure is much higher than this. According to statistics Iran's unemployment rate is over 45 percent.

And due to economic pressures, those who have lost their jobs and expressed their objections, faced with charges such as "acting against national security" and have been imprisoned with heavy sentences.

Iran's life quality ratio has decreased 62 steps in the past five years, Iran ranks 150 among 194 countries. This is while Iran has huge resources of oil, gas, copper, water and ... and is among the firsts in the world.

Shocking Statistics of addiction and prostitution among women and children, and shattered families are other social deviances, which is a consequence of the economic problems.

Unofficial statistics indicate that there are 7 million working children in Iran. Half of these children are citizens of neighboring countries. The largest numbers of working children are between the ages of 10 to 15 years. Among these there are 17 thousand street children. These children are often sexually abused by their employers.

Over 155.369 divorces were recorded in the civil registration.

Average age of prostitution has decreased from 20-30 to 12-18 years old.

Age of runaway girls has decreased 7 to 19.

Over 600 thousand women are engaged in prostitution; nearly 12 percent of them are married women.

According to statistics from an institution affiliated to the University of Welfare and Rehabilitation Sciences, there are one million and 200 thousand formal or professional drug addicts and 800 thousand drug users who occasionally use drugs.

According to official statistics, 45% of one million and 200 thousand addicted are under thirty years old.

In a report from the Drug Control Headquarters said: "Thirty percent of addicts aged 20 to 24 years old. Drug use among has increased among teens especially in women." According to the same report, 16 percent of addicts are young people under 20 years old.

Earlier this year, General Justice Deputy Attorney announced that the total number of prisoners in Iran, close to 170 thousand people and about 70 percent of them are directly or indirectly associated with drugs.

8 to 10 percent of public drivers use drugs.

Statistics related to addiction in women has risen sharply in recent years.

Experts have declared cheap cost and availability of drug as one of the causes of addiction in Iran.

More than 20 million people live in the old infrastructures.

Drug shortages caused by neglect Iranian officials in recent years has become one of the main problems of Iranian society.

Yet despite these alarming statistics which are based on documented reports and human rights organizations and the international community are aware of it, they have been silent about human rights violations in Iran.

The silence of the international community about "human rights violations" in countries such as Iran, dictates a thing to the mind of smart and conscious man and that is nothing but following their own interest. In this regard we can mention various contracts and agreements between the powerful industrial nations and the Islamic Republic.

Human Rights has become a demagogues term in the to loot nations not to help them.
