

Kids With Cancer Being Turned Away From Treatment--Thanks, Shutdown!

One result: director Francis Collins said about 200 patients who otherwise would be admitted to the NIH Clinical Center into clinical trials each week will be turned away. This includes about 30 children, most of them cancer patients, he said.

Meanwhile, in Idaho, no one is available to look for 63-year-old missing woman Jo Elliott-Blakeslee, who disappeared while hiking at the Craters of the Moon National Monument.
