The southern border wall may be coming. Do you know why? A quiz

President Trump has declared a national emergency in an attempt to override Congress's refusal to even partially fund what could easily become a \$30 billion project. If the national emergency declaration is not overridden, the funds will come from approved military projects.

If both illegal immigration and the number of illegal immigrants in the U.S. have been declining, most of the undocumented immigrants in the U.S. got here on legal visas and undocumented immigrants are less of a threat than our own citizens, what is the purpose of the wall? U.S. Customs and Border Protection officials want more agents and better technology, and some physical barriers, but not a "big, beautiful wall."

We are facing much larger threats than illegal migration from across the southern border. The national opioid crisis took over 70,000 lives last year. Our infrastructure is crumbling. We still have millions without health care. We are under constant cyberattack by Russia and China. Yet our entire focus as a country has been on an unnecessary government shutdown and a declared national emergency that is anything but a true emergency.

What are our elected officials thinking? Can party politics override common sense and the national interest? Apparently.

I urge you to write or call your congressman and senators to demand that funding NOT be removed from critical defense projects like cyber security. Yes, we need border security, but not a wasteful and easily circumvented wall. Please ask your representative to override the phony national emergency declaration.
