Mr. Savageau referenced former Congressman Barney Frank: "For Republicans, life begins at conception and ends at birth." Does that hold true for all pro-lifers? Or do they believe in the value and dignity of life at all stages — from womb to tomb?

If you are pro-life, are you against the death penalty? If you are pro-life, are you against unjust wars? Are you for eradicating hunger and homelessness? Are you for protecting the environment and being good stewards of the Earth? If we destroy the planet, there's no life whatsoever.

When you stop to think about it, we're really just parasites needing a host in order to live. No Earth = No Life.

If you are pro-life, are you for sensible gun-control laws? According to Cato Institute data, from 1975 to 2015, terrorists in the seven nations included in President Trump's travel ban killed zero — zero! — people in the U.S. In that same period, guns claimed 1.34 million lives in America.

If you are pro-life, are you ready to become a Samaritan? In a recent address to the World Meeting of Popular Movements, Pope Francis called on all to become Samaritans and not disown our neighbors. They are children of God and are entitled to be treated with human dignity. ... By helping to resettle the most vulnerable, we are living out our Christian faith as Jesus challenged us to do."

Are you truly pro-life, or are you just anti-abortion? Just wondering.

Just wondering, too, how one can say that Mr. Savageau's views on the Trump administration and the GOP are "totally inaccurate and border on hyperbole" and "are unfounded claims and exaggerated fears." Are you kidding me?
