The countries that took the top 10 places, in order, were Switzerland, New Zealand, Denmark, Estonia, Ireland, Canada and Finland (tied at 6), Australia, Sweden, and Luxembourg.

Eight in 10 people are living in a nation that is partly free or not free, according to Freedom House. Countries in every region of the world have or are leaning toward an autocratic form of government. China, Russia, Nicaragua, Hungary, North Korea, Venezuela, Afghanistan, Myanmar, Iran, and Mali. Even Italy, a nation we would traditionally think of as free, recently elected a right-wing leader. Others are gaining ground.

What does all this have to do with Edwardsville/Glen Carbon? I'll tell you. Your vote is essential in stopping this trend. Yes, yours. National trends begin locally and expand to the national level. Without a base in the countryside, autocrats or wannabe autocrats like Trump and Florida

Governor DeSantis cannot gain power. They are just fringe elements in an otherwise rational democracy. It starts down ballot at the precinct level, then to city council, mayor, school board, community college, county board, judges, state representatives and senators, governor and so on.
