## Marjorie Taylor Greene Uses Gay Club Mass Shooting to Lie About Drugs

U.S. Rep. Marjorie Taylor Greene, known for her anti-LGBTQ+ rants and conspiracy theories, has reached perhaps a new low by using the Colorado Springs mass shooting to spread falsehoods about drug trafficking and to, of course, argue against gun control.

"Tragically, 300 Americans die of fentanyl poisoning everyday in America and Biden says and does nothing," she tweeted Sunday. "Tragically, 5 people were killed in a shooting in Colorado and Biden immediately demands a ban on assault weapons.

"The solutions are this: 1. Secure the border and stop the drugs. 2. Defend our right to keep and bear arms so that people can defend themselves from killers who could care less about laws."

However, she ignored the fact that most of the fentanyl sold in the U.S. is sold by citizens. A recent study by the Cato Institute, a libertarian think tank, reported that 86.3 percent of convicted fentanyl traffickers are U.S. citizens. The study used government data.

A reporter from *The Independent* confronted Greene about this at a press conference Thursday where she contended the U.S. is doing more to protect Ukraine than to protect its own border with Mexico. The reporter cited the Cato study, and Greene responded, "The Cato Institute is not the border patrol. I'm sorry, is the Cato down there securing our border and stopping illegal aliens and human trafficking and drug trafficking? I'm sorry, you're going to have to get a direct source, and when you bring the border patrol in here and quote that, then we may take you seriously."

Biden indeed called for reinstating the assault weapons ban after the shooting at Club Q in Colorado Springs, where five people were killed and at least 18 injured Saturday night. But he has backed the ban on many occasions throughout his career.

"Today, yet another community in America has been torn apart by gun violence," he said in a prepared statement. "More families left with an empty chair at the table and hole in their lives that cannot be filled. When will we decide we've had enough? We must address the public health epidemic of gun violence in all of its forms. Earlier this year, I signed the most significant gun safety law in nearly three decades, in addition to taking other historic actions. But we must do more. We need to enact an assault weapons ban to get weapons of war off America's streets."

The gunman at Club Q is believed to have used an AR-15 assault rifle, one of the weapons that would be banned, according to *The Independent*. When Biden was a U.S. senator, he championed a ban on assault weapons and high-capacity magazines, which passed and was in effect from 1994 to 2004. Efforts since then to reauthorize it have failed.
