On the day of the shooting, as described in Pollack's book, the school campus security guard sitting in his golf cart, saw Cruz enter the school with a gun case, but never called a "code red." Why? Because he could only call a code red to the assistant principal who was attending his daughter's graduation in Maryland.

Our country is mentally sick and the woke identity politics of the Biden Administration is making it worse. Of the trillions spent and proposed on "infrastructure," how much is marked for mental health?
