

Ickler: A new year and more foolish than ever

"That ain't what Mitt Romney says," Uncle Fud said. "The Old Mittser, who just elected to the Senate out in Utah, actually said Trump's performance ain't been up to snuff."

"I'm afraid I don't expect Romney to lead a Republican resistance movement against some of Trump's nonsense," Aunt Dud said. "As I remember Romney, he was noted for changing his position to go with whatever he thought would get him elected on several controversial issues."
