President Trump, please heed your heart, head on dreamers

On Thursday, <u>Fox News reported</u> that President <u>Donald Trump</u> was expected to end the Deferred Action for Child Arrivals (DACA) program, established by President <u>Barack Obama</u> to give some legal protections to <u>nearly 800,000 immigrants</u> who entered the country without permission as children and are on track to have productive, positive lives thanks to the program's two-year work and study permits. Soon after, the White House denied the report and said it had made no decision on the <u>ultimatum</u> from 10 states to end the program by Tuesday or face a challenge to its legality in federal court.

The president should follow the sentiment he showed earlier this year when he called these immigrants — colloquially known as "dreamers" — <u>"incredible kids"</u> and said he would consider their fate with a "big heart." He should order Attorney General Jeff Sessions to defend Obama's executive order all the way to the Supreme Court while working with Congress to enact one of <u>four existing proposals</u> to provide some protections to DACA enrollees.

But even if Trump decides with his head instead of his heart, there's a strong case to let dreamers stay. Reports from both the conservative-libertarian <u>Cato Institute</u> and the liberal team of the <u>Center for American Progress and FWD.us</u> found that their deportation would harm the U.S. economy — because constructive people are good for America.
