Re "50 years on, environmentalist just as relevant" (Monitor Forum, Sept. 19):

Mike Di Paola notes that the industrial right still won't let Rachel Carson rest in peace, nearly 50 years after her passing: "The libertarian Cato Institute, cofounded in 1977 by chemical merchant David Koch, is marking the anniversary of Silent Spring with its own contrarian publication titled The False Crises of Rachel Carson."

Of course, the only false crises are coming from entities such as Cato, which are known for downplaying, if not outright denying, the risks of fossil-fueled climate change. Similar industry-funded think tanks have also engaged in character assaults on climate scientists such as James Hansen and Michael Mann, as well as demonization of such market-based concepts as revenue-neutral carbon pricing.

Shouldn't these think tanks demonstrate some thoughtfulness about the health and safety of future generations, the way Rachel Carson did?
