As Andrew Coulson notes in his blog at Cato: "Virtually the entire illiterate population has completed elementary school, the level at which reading is theoretically <u>taught</u>. That's seven years of schooling (k-6), at a cost of roughly \$100,000, for... nothing."

By way of epitaph, last month every teacher in the Detroit public school system was laid off.
