

Trump economic advisor to speak at Ridgefield's Reagan Dinner

The Ridgefield Republican Town Committee is holding its first annual Reagan Dinner Sunday, Sept. 18 at Stonehenge Restaurant starting at 6:00 p.m. which will honor the memory and legacy of President Ronald Reagan.

Chairman Alex Karsanidi announced Monday that the event's keynote speaker is Stephen Moore, senior economic advisor to presidential candidate Donald Trump, who was instrumental in formulating the economic plan recently put forward by Trump.

"Anyone at all interested in the upcoming Presidential Election will find his presentation both interesting and informative, which will followed with Q&A from attendees," said Karsanidi.

In 1987, Stephen Moore was Research Director for President Ronald Reagan's Privatization Commission, after which he served 10 years as a fellow of the Cato Institute.

He was the Senior Economist of the U.S. Congress Joint Economic Committee under Chairman Dick Armeyand and was instrumental in creating the Fair Tax proposal.

Moore founded and was President of the Club for Growth from 1999 to 2004.

He then founded the Free Enterprise Fund with Economists Mallory Factor and Arthur Laffer, and is a partner is the econometrics firm, Arduin, Laffer and Moore Econometrics.

Moore is currently a distinguished visiting fellow at the Heritage Foundation and formerly an editorial board member of the Wall Street Journal.

He is also a contributing editor for the National Review.

There will be a wine Reception from 6 to 7 p.m., a gourmet dinner from 7 to 8, followed by the speaker presentation and question and answer session.

This will be followed by a book signing with Stephen Moore of his newly released book, Fueling Freedom.
