## Ten years at PLF

Today is my 10-year anniversary as an attorney at the <u>Pacific Legal Foundation</u>. It definitely does not feel like it. For about nine of those years, my energies have been primarily devoted to the Foundation's Economic Liberty Project, devoted to defending the right to earn a living—which was, of course, the subject of <u>my 2010 book of that title</u>. That project succeeded in setting crucially important precedent in the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals, <u>Merrifield v. Lockyer</u>, declaring that government may not use its occupational licensing laws simply to protect established businesses against economic competition. We've also put an end to anti-competitive laws in the moving industry in <u>Oregon</u> and <u>Missouri</u>, and are now fighting for economic liberty in <u>Nebraska</u>, <u>Kentucky</u>, California, and elsewhere.
