

## Gary Johnson could play role of spoiler in Arizona

Johnson has support from 11% of the voters in Virginia and Stein has 3%.

"I support Gary Johnson because it is obvious that the primary two candidates do not offer real choices or bring in the kinds of ideas that the majority of Americans actually want", Pearl said. "And so you're doing a rally in Des Moines, Iowa, but guess what?" (Hawaii is a toss-up.) But she's still polling pretty well for a minor-party candidate. "That's how insane it is".

The former Republican governor of New Mexico is drawing significant support from younger voters and independents who are unsatisfied with Democratic nominee Hillary Clinton and Republican Donald Trump, according to a Pew Research Center poll published on August 18.

"By dire consequences, I don't think there's any way you can be elected president and not be in the presidential debates", he said in an interview before an event at Grand View University.

Johnson supports abortion rights and marijuana legalization, advocates for a non-interventionist foreign policy and is opposed to religious freedom laws, believing them to be bigoted against gay Americans. "We're planning a partnership".

The Libertarian ticket includes two former Republican governors, in Johnson of New Mexico and Bill Weld of MA, but McMullin said he couldn't support them because "they've moved way left" in the general election. Kim said that organization will be the club responsible for *all* things involving Johnson. State delegations would be unlikely to switch from Clinton to Trump, or vice versa.

But it seems that only two of them, Clinton and Trump, thus far, will be allowed to participate in presidential debates.

However, as an Independent - which category, by the way, contains more registered voters than either the Democratic or Republican parties - I would like to hear from *all* the candidates. Either way, Donald Trump is well on his way to collecting *all* 8 of Louisiana's electoral votes.

According to his website, Johnson believes that the national debt is the greatest threat to USA national security, and on immigration, Johnson believes the problem shouldn't be solved by "building a wall or simply offering amnesty". "We are a country of immigrants".

Members of the Green Party also shared this sentiment, but pointed out some of the problems with the logistics of getting Stein on a debate stage.

If TV spots and polling numbers don't get Gary Johnson into the debates, he may have another card up his sleeve: public pressure. I have no issue with the 15 percent, either. What's more, the executive vice president of the CATO Institute is none other than David Boaz, the same person the author mentioned people should read if they want to learn more about libertarianism.

Enter Gary Johnson and his running mate Bill Weld, both of whom are on track to lead the Libertarian Party to its greatest share of the presidential vote this fall. "I can't believe that you're here on a Saturday afternoon, but you are here. Let's make a difference in this election".
