IN AMERICA, ELECTION BUYS YOU! - Politico: "A Georgian billionaire has taken Washington by storm, hiring more than half a dozen lobbying and public relations firms over the past three months. Bidzina Ivanishvili wants to become an official candidate in the country's first prime minister race and he hopes that U.S. pressure for free and fair elections will help, since that could be a step toward Georgia's long-held goal of being recognized by NATO. The lobbying push is massive -- going beyond what most countries spend trying to influence Washington lawmakers, much less an individual. Venerable firms like Patton Boggs, National Strategies, Downey McGrath Group, Parry Romani Deconcini & Symms and BGR Group have all signed on to lobby for Ivanishvili. KL Global and Democratic communicator Peter Mirijanian have also recently done proactive press outreach for him." [Politico]

## CONTROVERSIAL, LEADERLESS MOVEMENT FRACTURING...

SOMEHOW - Paul Blumenthal: "A split is opening up between two forces that helped to launch the Tea Party in 2009. FreedomWorks, a free market/limited government advocacy group, released a statement Thursday criticizing the move by billionaire industrialists Charles and David Koch to sue for majority control of the libertarian Cato Institute...FreedomWorks worked hand-in-glove with the Koch brothers-funded group Americans for Prosperity to help rally the Tea Party movement in 2009. The two groups teamed up to sponsor the Tea Party Tax Day Protest that followed a televised rant against government support for homeowners facing foreclosure by CNBC's Rick Santelli. Thursday's statement calls the Kochs' move a 'hostile takeover' of Cato, echoing words used by Cato President Ed Crane, who has vocally opposed. Supporters of Cato suspect that the Kochs, who are shareholders in the institute, want to seize majority control to pull Cato into their partisan political infrastructure. The fear is that this move will turn Cato away from its support for and research on positions outside the conservative mainstream, including issues of the war on drugs, civil liberties and militarism." CHARLOTTE CONVENTION REMINDING DEMOCRATS THAT NORTH CAROLINA IS STILL IN THE SOUTH - Jason Cherkis and Rhiannon Fionn-Bowman: "Whatever the considerations in the choice, a lot about Charlotte goes

unmentioned: double-digit unemployment, overflowing homeless shelters and North Carolina's notorious restrictions on labor unions. Although unions are participating in the convention, more than a dozen unions have announced a boycott of the event.

'We find it troubling that the party so closely associated with basic human rights would choose a state with the lowest unionization rate in the country due to regressive policies aimed at diluting the power of workers,' wrote Mark Ayers, president of the building trades unit, to DNC Chairwoman Debbie Wasserman Schultz last summer.
