

Udall Issues Statement On NAFTA Deal

Democrats want a trade bill that strengthen protections for American workers in the wake of lower-cost options overseas, particularly in the wake of General Motor's announcement to shutter five USA factories.

Trump had to submit the text of the agreement to Congress by Friday to set up a slim chance of passing implementation legislation for the deal before January, when Democrats will assume the House majority. "A great deal." Trump said Saturday, during a press conference on Air Force One.

In a blog entry posted shortly after the agreement was signed Friday, Cato Institute trade analyst Simon Lester appeared to anticipate Trump's move - although he acknowledged it would have made a lot more sense if the Republicans still had control of Congress.

It will require approval from each country's legislature, and in the U.S., Democrats in Congress, in particular, have voiced concerns about its labor and environmental protections.

The leaders of the three countries agreed on a deal in principle to replace NAFTA, which governs more than United States dollars 1.2 trillion of mutual trade, after acrimonious negotiations concluded on September 30.
