Rosen resignation sets up a unique Libertarian vs. libertarian Republican race in MD's 1st CD

Not being covered by any media, blogs or news sites, Wendy Rosen's sudden resignation of her Democrat nomination for congress, over allegations of serious voter fraud, creates a rather unique race: Libertarian Republican incumbent Rep. Andy Harris, is now only seriously challenged by a Libertarian Party nominee.

Harris is a Tea Partyer. A physician, he is a staunch advocate of free market alternatives on health care. He even attended Cato Institute conferences and touted Cato policy proposals in previous campaigns.

Harris has racked up an impressive (especially for an East Coast Republican), 83, B+ score from the National Taxpayers Union (NTU) for 2011. He is ranked 50th in the House as most libertarian on tax and spending.

Muir Boda, the Libertarian Party nominee for the seat is not your typical Libertarian. He leans more to the right side. Boda has run for office twice before in Salisbury for city council. His platform included tough on crime proposals, and urban reform measures, including strengthening the ability of law enforcement to deal with Salisbury's growing juvenile crime rate.
