"This is the time to put up or shut up. Governor Christie has to decide he's going to walk the walk on this one," Clark Neily, a senior attorney at the Institute for Justice, told The Daily Caller.

Tim Lynch, president of the Cato Institute's Project on Criminal Justice, said "Governors are given this responsibility, and this seems to be Exhibit A of a person who is deserving of a pardon. He could really, not only correct an injustice in this case, but he could show other governors how it's done."
