David Boaz, Executive VP of Cato, Tells MHD Why He's Optimistic About the Growing Freedom Movement

I should note that I personally owe a lot both to Cato and to David. When at <u>Strand Books</u> in NYC with my bro Tom back in the day I inquired about books on libertarianism. I was handed <u>The Libertarian Reader</u>, which David edited, and was quickly introduced to many of the best minds of the political philosophy, including an essay by Herbert Spencer called <u>"The Right to Ignore the State"</u> which was one of the first readings that caused me to question the legitimacy of the State.

Later, after deepening and broadening my grasp on the ideas of liberty (with much credit due to those active with the <u>College Libertarians at Western Illinois University</u>) I applied and was accepted at Cato as an intern in the Spring of 2005 by then-intern coordinator <u>Krystal Brand</u> (now Slivinski). There, I worked with the folks in <u>Foreign Policy and Defense</u> and when able, helped those in the <u>Constitutional Studies</u> area. Needless to say, it was an education that helped shape me into the person I am today and for that I am very thankful.
