

## Freedom Seminar to explore 'America at the Crossroads: Challenges and Opportunities for the Next Generation'

44th annual event kicks off Thursday at Northwood University

MIDLAND — Northwood University hosts its 44<sup>th</sup> Freedom Seminar, "America at the Crossroads: Challenges and Opportunities for the Next Generation" this week.

The Northwood University Freedom Seminar, April 7-10, is a symposium on the free-enterprise system led by academic and business leaders. The purpose of the seminar is to explore business and economic topics of interest to the academic and business communities. Students and members of the Midland community can register to attend the sessions.

"Compared to previous generations, surveys show that young Americans are more negative about the current state of the world," said Dale Matcheck, Economics Department chair and seminar co-organizer. "This is no surprise, having come of age during the War on Terror, Great Recession, COVID pandemic, Russia's invasion in Ukraine, and other historically significant events that have shaped their world view.

"On the other hand, surveys also show that today's young people are more optimistic than previous generations about their future and confident in their ability to make a positive impact on the world."

Matcheck noted the sessions will be organized around three key areas of concern to young people: the economy, the environment and society.
