

## Libertarian Perspectives on Midterm Election



The Republicans have captured the U.S. House in a truly historic wave that even surpasses the 1994 "Republican Revolution." With a net gain of over 60 seats, the House GOP claims to have a mandate from the people to shrink government, including a vow to repeal Obama's health care legislation.

While Mr. Obama addressed the nation today by saying that the GOP's gains were not a referendum on his policies, but the result of frustration over a stalling economy, the truth is that Democrats who voted for Obama's health care legislation "dropped like flies" Tuesday.

To give an idea of how bad election day was for the Democrats, they have lost *literally centuries* of seniority in the House, with at least seven lawmakers of 20 years' or more seniority losing their elections. When all the votes are finally tallied, the Democrats may have lost as much as 430 years of seniority in the House.
