

Washington Needs To Cut Spending

"When we already have 500 billion dollar deficits projected to rise to over a trillion dollars, to do a multi-trillion dollar tax cut, I just worry that politicians won't agree to that so therefore, we need to try extra hard to somehow put a cap on the growth of government spending to give us lots of breathing room for lower tax rates," Mitchell said.

Mitchell said in order for this tax plan to move through Congress, the Trump White House and Congressional Republicans have to get serious about government spending.

Mitchell said the Trump administration plans to release their full budget in May, and if it includes less spending and entitlement reform, then the budget and tax reform can be married together for great economic growth.
