He is a contributing opinion columnist for the *Washington Post* and the author of several books, and his most recent book is *Presidential Elections and Majority Rule: The Rise, Demise, and Potential Restoration of the Jeffersonian Electoral College*.

<u>David French</u> served as a member of Team Conservative for the *Guardrails* initiative. He is senior editor for *The Dispatch*, where he also writes the weekly newsletter *The French Press* and co-hosts the weekly podcast *Advisory Opinions*. He is a contributing writer for *The Atlantic* where he is also the author of its newsletter *The Third Rail*. His most recent book is *Divided We Fall: America's Secession Threat and How to Restore Our Nation*.

<u>Ilya Somin</u> served as member of Team Libertarian for the *Guardrails* initiative. He is professor of law at the Antonin Scalia Law School at George Mason University and a regular contributor to the *Volokh Conspiracy* law and politics blog, hosted by *Reason* magazine. He is the author of several books, and his most recent book is *Free to Move: Foot Voting, Migration, and Political Freedom.*

<u>Jeffrey Rosen</u> is the president and CEO of the National Constitution Center, a nonpartisan nonprofit organization devoted to educating the public about the U.S. Constitution. Rosen is also professor of law at The George Washington University Law School and a contributing editor of *The Atlantic*.
