

Will New Yorkers ever be free of endless government rules and sky-high taxes?

Among the gripes: New York's Big Brother government too often tells businesses what to do. Its smoking bans and "stratospheric" cigarette taxes make it worst for tobacco freedom. Rent control is "economically devastating."

The study cites New York's fireworks ban, restrictive gun laws, minimum wage and prohibition on selling wine in groceries. And, of course, taxes: twice the average state.
