Orange Comm. Stewart Opens Mayoral Campaign HQ Today

One year out from the 2010 county mayor's race, Orange County Commissioner Linda Stewart is opening her campaign headquarters at the Fort Gatlin Shopping Center today.

Stewart, a Democrat, is a current front-runner among a handful of early entrants into the race.

Fellow Democratic Commissioner **Bill Segal** is another key **front-runner**, but his campaign manager said that with the political donation environment so tight, his campaign will wait to open a field office after the first of the year. "We don't want to waste money," said **Eric Foglesong**, Segal's political chief and former aide.

Another **emerging candidate in the race**, businessman **Matt Falconer**, grabbed the endorsement of one of the lesser-known names to announce for upcoming mayor's race: **Michael Newcomb**:

Falconer said he also plans to address the county commission Tuesday morning during the public comment period, to argue against corporate welfare, citing a 1995 Cato Institute report on the issue.

Falconer says while the county has been giving away money or subsidizing projects -- such as with offering incentives to the Burnham Institute, or helping pay for a new arena for the Orlando Magic -- unemployment has continued to climb. Here's a copy of his prepared **remarks**.
