

## Page saluting Constitution Day reflected a partisan political agenda

I am still disturbed by the full page under the headline "It's 'we the people' day," which was published in the Post-Bulletin on Sept. 17. The text of the amendments, as published, bears only a slight resemblance to the actual wording, and is in fact, an inaccurate translation of the original.

It takes little research to discover that the source of the page, The Bill of Rights Institute, was established by the Charles G. Koch Foundation. The same Koch brothers who founded the conservative CATO Institute and Americans for Prosperity, the most influential American conservative political advocacy organization. Americans For Prosperity lobbies in opposition to global warming regulation, the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, the expansion of Medicaid and anti-gun control and helped to create the tea party movement.

The Post-Bulletin should disassociate itself from the dissemination of propaganda or label it as such.
