

Polpourri: Donald Rumsfeld's book omits one West Michigan detail

In his new autobiography, "Known and Unknown," former Defense Secretary Donald Rumsfeld does not refer to his family's cottage at Castle Park, the Lake Michigan resort south of Holland.

GOP activist Peter Secchia said Rumsfeld's low-profile visits there were more frequent when he did not hold office in Washington. Secchia said he occasionally dined with Rumsfeld in Saugatuck. Rumsfeld sold the place several years ago, Secchia said.

Otherwise, West Michigan references abound as Rumsfeld's recalls his early years as an aide to U.S. Sen. Robert

Griffin and his time in Congress and the White House with Gerald R. Ford. Rumsfeld will be at the Ford Presidential Museum for a private book-signing Monday.

Amash 'present' votes lauded in libertarian circles

U.S. Rep. Justin Amash's willingness to vote independently of even his conservative Republican colleagues continues to win him kudos in libertarian circles.

"Amash sounds like a representative trying to take his obligations seriously," the Cato Institute's John Samples **wrote last week** in response to Politico reports about Amash voting "present" when he hasn't had reasonable time to read legislation.

"Apparently he feels he owes his constituents his best judgment ... and, absent enough time, he refuses to delegate his judgment to party elders or to mere caprice. It says something about the culture of the capital that Amash's sense of fidelity to those who elected him occasions complaint."
