## Reactions to Court Ruling Striking Down Part of Obamacare in Virginia v. Sebelius

Yesterday, a federal judge in Richmond <u>struck down</u> <sup>[1]</sup> Obamacare's requirement that individuals buy health insurance. Cato Institute's Ilya Shapiro reacts to the decision <u>here in an article at CNN</u> <sup>[2]</sup>. Ilya was the principal author of an amicus brief filed on behalf of the Cato Institute and others in support of Virginia Attorney General Kenneth Cuccinelli's lawsuit against Obamacare.

The <u>Competitive Enterprise Institute</u> [3] and law professor Randy Barnett joined <u>that brief</u> [4], which you can <u>find here</u> [5]. I am listed on the brief since I made a few suggestions that were incorporated into the brief based on my past experience in handling federalism cases (such as the Supreme Court's <u>Morrison decision</u> [6]). The brief was submitted to the court by the distinguished Richmond lawyer Patrick McSweeney, who has won landmark cases (such as a notaxation-without-representation case in the Virginia Supreme Court called <u>Marshall</u> v. <u>Northern Virginia Regional Transportation Authority</u>, a case that I earlier <u>discussed at this link</u> [7]).

At Volokh Conspiracy, there are reactions to the decision from law professors Jonathan Adler [8] and Ilya Somin [9]. I earlier discussed the constitutional issue in the case here recently discussed the harm Obamacare inflicts on medical innovation [11], employers [12], the public [13] and access to quality health insurance [14]. The U.S. Attorney General and HHS Secretary responded to the ruling as well, as you can see here [15].
