"Roberts isn't motivated by any sort of ideology I'm able to pinpoint," acknowledged Josh Blackman, a professor at South Texas College of Regulation. "He's squarely within the heart."

In a series of cases, he sided with the Democratic appointees to shoot down regulations dispensing important sentencing or punishment.

He sided with the Democratic appointees in four 5-4 choices throughout the 9-month term.

Twenty-one in all the cases the <u>court docket</u> heard over the term possess been decided by 5-4 or 5-3 votes, but The Related Press acknowledged appropriate seven of these possess been the Republican appointees within the majority and the Democratic picks within the minority. Democratic appointees obtained one Republican make a selection to disclose the majority in 10 cases.

In varied cases, an anticipated ideological split didn't appear. One was as soon as the ruling permitting the Peace Inappropriate, a World Battle I memorial on public land in Bladensburg, Maryland, to remain.

Justices Stephen G. Breyer and Elena Kagan sided with the five Republican appointees to protect the execrable.
