## The AM Roundup: Mont. Judge Requests Probe over Racist Email

**Preemptive strike:** Richard Cebull, chief judge of the U.S. District Court in Montana, has initiated a disciplinary investigation into his own behavior after acknowledging he sent a racist e-mail to friends and family about President Obama. NLJ

**Sandusky**: A new court filing by prosecutors in the Pennsylvania State University child-sex-abuse case says the alleged victims of former assistant football coach Jerry Sandusky ranged in age from 8 to 17 and that eight were assaulted on campus. The 68-year-old Sandusky faces 52 criminal counts. He denies the allegations and pleaded not guilty. <u>WSJ</u>

**Trade secrets**: A former employee of DuPont Co. pleaded guilty in federal court in San Francisco on Thursday to taking trade secrets from the company and selling them to a Chinese government-owned firm. <u>WSJ</u>
