



Klaus to join Cato Institute after retired as Czech president

Czech President Vaclav Klaus will join the US conservative think-tank Cato Institute as from March when retired from the current position, the Presidential Office announced Wednesday.

Klaus has attended several conferences organised by the Cato institute and his cooperation with it was also mentioned by the double issue of Cato Policy Report at the end of 2012.

In 2008, Klaus mentioned the institute among the organisations that share his critical stand on the theories according to which man is behind global warming.

Cato Institute was founded in 1974, it focuses on free market, freedom and economic policy and it is the sixth most influential research organisation in the United States, according to the Global Go To Think Tank standings of 2011.
