When I was in the military, my civil service counterparts didn't have a "pension". They have a 401k type benefit where the government matches their input up to a certain amount. Now if they put aside 5 to 10 percent of their salary (I believe the government matches 1 for 1 the first 5% then a decreasing match for the next 5 percent.) Over a 40 year career that can add up to a large pension, but isn't out of line. In the old days the pensions were as you imply, but that was phased out in DoD back in the Reagan administration.
