Biovail, ▼ the drugmaker, slammed rival Teva, saying a proposed clinical trial of a generic version of **Biovail** ▼'s Wellbutrin XL antidepressant is too small and brief to be useful.

Burger King will open a "Whopper Bar South Beach" eatery in Miami Beach that'll serve beer and burgers, the fast-food chain's first U.S. location with alcohol. Adding beer at select locations is part of the chain's effort to reinvent itself and offer a sit-down feel. Shares rose.

RiskMetrics, a risk advisory firm, has put itself up for sale and spoken with potential bidders including Bloomberg, McGraw-Hill and Thomson Reuters, sources say.

Twitter, the popular "microblogging" service, disabled a feature that let users show their updates on other Web sites because of a security flaw in Adobe's Flash software that exposed passwords. Adobe has told developers how to fix the 4-year-old vulnerability, but many haven't followed the advice.
