GOP should back immigration reform

I am a Republican who supports comprehensive immigration reform, and I am not alone. According to a recent poll, 86 percent of all voters support reform that: "secures the border, cracks down on employers who hire illegal immigrants, and requires illegal immigrants to register for legal immigration status, pay back taxes, and learn English in order to be eligible for U.S. citizenship."
