The Kansas Libertarian Party has until September 20, to decide who their candidate will be for Congress in the 4th District. And that candidate might possibly be a Republican.

A spokesperson for Wink Hartman confirmed Saturday the former Fourth District Republican candidate is considering re-entering the race for Congress. Hartman would fill the spot on the Libertarian ticket left open by David Moffett, who has dropped out of the race for health reasons.

Michael O'Donnell says Hartman is considering re-entering the race because he believes that neither the Republican candidate, Mike Pompeo, or Democratic candidate, State Representative Raj Goyle, are addressing the issues most important to voters.

President of the Kansas Libertarian Party (LPKS), Andrew Gray said, "The LPKS is always open to candidates who fit our criteria of social freedom and economic liberty. We believe as this trend continues to enter the consciences of Kansans more and more viable candidates will enter the

election process."

Gray is also the Libertarian candidate for Governor along with Stacey Davis who is running as his Lt. Governor. The Kansas Libertarian Party hopes to make political strides in a year of Tea Party growth and low approval ratings for both Republican and Democratic members of Congress.

O'Donnell says that if Hartman decides to re-enter the race, he will meet with Libertarian officials to work out any ideological differences but believes that Hartman has always been a conservative candidate who simply wanted the "government out of people's everyday lives".

Libertarian President, Andrew Gray, has until September 20, 2010 before he must appoint a replacement for Moffett. O'Donnell says that win or loose, if Hartman runs, "he will definitely impact the outcome of the race."

Hartman is regarded as Wichita's top businessman.
