It's hard to solve common problems when the livelihood of so many of the rich and powerful depends on denying those problems exist while "creating other new realities". AEI thinks we should deal with the problem but at least they are dealing with it. How sad and strange that so many among us prefer comfortable lies that confirm their prejudices and secret hatreds rather than deal with the hard, frightening, gritty scientific realities. For that I applaud the AEI. Perhaps the rest of the conservative community will stumble along one day for the sake of their children, grandchildren and their souls.

I became reacquainted with the AEI in February in San Diego at the Annual Meeting of the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS). The very first symposium I attended was on Human Dimensions of Geoengineering. I expected to hear from scientists. Thus it came as a surprise that Samuel Thernstrom, an AEI "Resident Fellow" and "Codirector of the AEI Geoengineering Project" was a last-minute replacement for one of the scheduled speakers.

I was surprised because all I knew about the AEI and its connection to climate was the story about its efforts to undermine the IPCC report in 2007. But here was Thernstrom, who I learned was President Bush's Director of Communications of the White House Council on Environmental Quality from 2001 to 2003, talking about human-caused climate change as if it was a fact that everyone accepted. I don't have a transcript of his talk but he is a prolific writer so I can convey the gist of his message.

One month ago he published a piece titled, "What Role for Geoengineering?" It is abundantly clear from the first line that he accepts the scientific consensus that humans are responsible for global warming. He wrote, "Any effective climate strategy will have to rely upon a combination of emissions reductions, adaptation, and, if circumstances warrant (as appears likely), some degree of geoengineering."

Now that is refreshing. No denial. No lies. Just pragmatic and matter-of-fact. Clearly reality-based.

He referred to "Nobel Prize laureate and atmospheric chemist" Paul Crutzen's 2006 article "calling for research on geoengineering." He also mentioned a 2001 "Department of Energy...white paper proposing a five-year research program on geoengineering" and how "the Bush administration balked, fearing how such a proposal would be perceived. A conservative president who opposed emissions limits could not afford to call for geoengineering research."


