Gov. Charlie Crist's administration is sounding the alarm about the Legislature's proposed budget cuts to the Department of Corrections, warning it could trigger the early release of inmates. "We are fighting this tooth and nail to make sure this doesn't come to fruition," said Walt McNeil, the department's secretary. The agency's budget in the Senate would lead to the closure of five prisons, including two to accommodate the opening of a privately run prison along the Blackwater River in the Panhandle. The \$110 million Blackwater facility was added to the Senate budget at the last minute by chief budget writer J.D. Alexander.
