

Immigration policy shouldn't be based on myths

"Angel families," family members of a person killed by an illegal immigrant, were hosted in a press conference at the White House last week. Each one of these cases is a tragedy, but they are outliers and not the norm.

A study published by the Cato Institute in February 2018 showed native-born Americans were far more likely to commit a violent or nonviolent crime than legal or illegal immigrants. Another study, published in March by the Journal of Criminology, looked at population-level crime rates. It concluded that from 1990 to 2014 increases in the undocumented immigrant population was associated with significant decreases in violence.

Our immigration system is clearly in need of improvement. But fear mongering, demonizing entire groups of people and provoking racial tensions will not lead to effective immigration policy. We need clear heads, truthful data and thoughtful debate.
