



## **Trump associates immigration and crimes in an act with relatives of victims**

The separation of undocumented migrant children from their families on border has unleashed such a wave of outrage outside and within United States that Donald Trump was forced on Wednesday to rectify his policy and push an executive order that, with many technical gaps and Legal, stop this practice. This Friday, however, countered in public opinion with an act that associated without complex immigration and crime.

Trump went on a stage with parents of children and teenagers who had been killed by irregular immigrants. "All I have left of my son are se Ashes," said a woman with a boat in her hand, after recounting how her 13-year-old boy had been killed. "Thanks to police and border guard, keep fighting," he toppled. Anor told how her daughter had died 24 hours after graduating. "My separation is permanent," he cried. Anor, he explained that his had been kidnapped, raped and stabbed to death.

The relatives were one by one telling their story, to which more heartbreaking, stressing at all times foreign origin of offender and, not only foreign, but his status as a foreigner without papers. For a moment it seemed that terrible loss would have been less at hands of someone with his documents in order.

There is no evidence that increased immigration leads to more violence. On contrary, several studies indicate opposite specifically to irregular aliens. A report by Cato Institute, a libertarian-cutting ideas laboratory, analyzed data from Texas Department of Public Safety at 2015 to conclude that undocumented ones concentrated a much lower criminal conviction rate than natives: in relation to their weight in population, there were 56% fewer convictions. Anor, published in March by newspaper Criminology and quoted this week by Washington Post, emphasized that States with most irregular immigrant population recorded less crime rates than those with less without papers, analyzing period 1990-2014. "These are U.S. citizens permanently separated from their loved ones," Trump said in act of this Trump. "It's time to support our police, protect our families and save American lives," president added.

The Association of Immigration to Crime has been one of Trump's great strategies in migratory debate. At Republican summer convention of 2016, when it was crowned as presidential candidate, relatives of victims of violent crimes committed, as they were counting on stage, were also involved by irregular immigrants. Her administration has created victims of immigration crime Engagement's Office of Victims of Immigration crimes, acronym of which forms word voice.
