Prior to 1860 the best manufactured goods in the world didn't come from Northern US factories but rather Britain, Germany and other countries. The federal government was financed primarily by tariffs designed to protect Northern industries. The second category of taxation was the excise tax which between them provided almost all federal revenue.

Southern states bought manufactured goods from Europe as Northern goods were viewed as Japanese goods were circa 1955. Thus, the Southern states contributed over 75% of the cost of the dederal government with 29% of the population carrying much of the tax load for the other 71% of the population. Did this cause resentment? Figure it out yourself.

When the United States declared independence from Britain, it effectively seceeded, establishing the legal precedent and means for secession.

Taking their cue from the forbearers in 1776, eleven southern states did exactly the same thing as the thirteen colonies did. Four slaveholding states didn't secede. This suggests that slavery was not the key issue but rather independence and unjust taxation.

By the way the figures on tariffs and percentages came from the US Treasury after several weeks of digging into microfilm files as that data is not in a database. I truly enjoyed my trip to the Library of Congress and hope you do as well. The data is there.

My ancestors were Southerners and Unionists and fought in Union forces for reasons I'll probably never understand
