Expecting Rep. Barney Frank to turn up at an occasion organized by the libertarian Cato institute is a bit of a long shot, but that is exactly what the veteran liberal congressman did on Friday, at an event that became an overview discussion of the different budget-hacking proposals that have been aired in Washington in the past month.

On the other side of the debate, the "Defending Defense" alliance - the conservative group that wants to declare the defense budget off-limits decided not to show up.

Asked about the new leadership in the House armed services and appropriations committees, Frank said that the issue would be more important "if the normal rules applied. But they're not going to be in charge any more." With the nation and congress focused on fiscal issues "the budget committees will be much more important."

Frank says that new and rising representatives are trying (for the first time) to steer away from the appropriations committees since they are likely to be doling out cuts rather than contracts. "It's going to be a pain in the ass, not a perk."

As for the possibility of serious change, Frank added, "I'm encouraged that there is a debate." Mentioning Sen John McCain's attack on newly elected Sen Rand Paul's "isolationism", Frank observed that "you don't do that unless you see that something is getting traction."

Another key quote from the debate, from Cato defense analyst Ben Friedman: "Many of the new Republicans have no coherent position on defense. And that gives me hope.'
