Our happy warriors for human liberty, Mark Landsbaum, Brian Calle and John Seiler, wrote the three essays on the cover that probe "Entitlements or Independence?" and "Why the Declaration Still Matters" and "What would the Founders Think Today?"

Deputy Editor Mike Tipping selected three essays that appear on Page Six, which focus on liberty in peril, by local contributors Stan Cohen, Richard Ralston and John Coupal. Mike chose for Page Two an essay by Cypress resident and Revolutionary War authority Dana Parker that explains the insurrection leading up to the signing of the Declaration.
