A few days later it was announced that Social Security will pay out more in benefits this year than it takes in. So, Ms. Pelosi compared Obamacare to another sweeping government entitlement program, one which is going into the red even sooner than predicted.

In 2009, the Social Security Administration's annual report estimated that the program's trust fund would be exhausted by 2037 - four years earlier than prior predictions. Making matters worse was the Congressional Budget Office announcement last week that the governmentrun retirement program would show a deficit this year. The SSA is expected to release soon its 2010 report, with new projections. No matter the findings, a rude awakening is coming; it is just a question of when.

Two of the most-mentioned fixes for Social Security are raising taxes and reducing benefits, including by raising the retirement age, which we would characterize as bandaging a wound that needs sutures. Sure, they might help in the interim but they don't alter the unsustainable nature of Social Security itself. As Jose Pinera of the Cato Institute put it, "Pay-as-you-go social security systems destroy the link between contributions and benefits. Everyone tries to minimize what he puts into the system while trying to maximize through political pressure what he can get out of it.'

A better approach is a multitiered personal retirement account system like is found in Chile. Citizens choose a program that fits their particular needs, depending on age, risk and other factors, giving them choice, control and flexibility over their retirement. Even with the global recession, Chileans have fared well.

Another viable option ought to be an opt-out program, which would allow Americans, especially young adults, to stay out of Social Security altogether.
