# Obama in tight spot on Gaza conflict

With no letup in tensions surrounding Israel's recent attack on a Gaza-bound ship, the White House is looking for a new direction on easing conflict in the region.

On Wednesday, President Obama will meet with Palestinian Authority President Mahmoud Abbas at the White House. On Monday, Vice President Biden discussed the matter in Turkey with President Hosni Mubarak.

"We are consulting closely with Egypt, as well as our other partners, on new ways to address the humanitarian, economic, security and political aspects of the situation in Gaza," Biden said.

In a tough spot between key allies, the White House has declined to condemn Israel for the May 31 incident, in which nine people were killed on a Turkish-owned ship trying to run relief supplies through an Israeli blockade of the Gaza Strip.

Before arriving in Washington, Abbas will stop in Turkey, where public and government outrage over the incident has been uncommonly intense.

"Turkey has been raising its diplomatic profile and increasing its influence in regions beyond its borders, particularly in the Middle East," said Bulent Aliriza, an expert on Turkey at the Center for Strategic and International Studies.

The government of Turkey had hoped to put international pressure on Israel to end its four-year-old blockade of Gaza.

For the Obama administration, the incident presents several challenges on multiple fronts -- including its close alliance with Israel, efforts to broker peace in the Middle East, the president's outreach to Muslims, and the U.S. relationship with Turkey, among others.

Also at issue for the White House are numerous U.S. based interest groups -- including those who supported Obama politically -- with a strong stake in the Middle East peace process.

A planned meeting at the White House between Obama and Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu

was scrapped last week after the flotilla incident.

So far, the administration has split the difference in a way that has made no side of the multi-faceted dispute happy, by proceeding with an excess of caution.

"The current arrangements are unsustainable and must be changed," National Security Council spokesman Mike Hammer said of the delivery of aid to the Gaza Strip.

But, "For now, we call on all parties to join us in encouraging responsible decisions by all sides to avoid any unnecessary confrontations," he said.

Michael Oren, Israel's ambassador to the U.S., told Fox News that Israelis are "open to any ideas," but that allowing sea access to Gaza would permit Hamas, the Islamist group that controls Gaza, to acquire sufficient arms to threaten Israel and "kill" the peace process.

"The administration is in an impossible situation, to be honest with you," said Christopher Preble, director of foreign policy studies at the libertarian Cato Institute.

Meanwhile, the administration has extended itself on the peace process, he said "and the ability to deliver what five administrations tried and failed to do."
